## 2018 Ag Awareness

As your Ag Awareness Coordinator for several years now, I am so proud of the County Fairs that continue to utilize the to improve exhibits and equipment in their Agriculture areas. This year highlighted some great projects and much need new equipment for some.

The Fairs that completed project were; Madison County Fair with some additional signage encouraging the fairgoer to look inside the building for more information. Ulster County Fair expanded their Ag Awareness tent with the purchase of "Lucy Lo", the milking cow. The Boonville Fair used Ag Awareness to show how our food is grown, harvested and marketed to the public. The Cayuga County Fair is creating a new show grounds, so a sound system for the livestock showring was a welcome addition. Chemung County Fair purchase new goat pens for the growing interest in this small specie. Washington County Fair created nice new handwashing signage and placed throughout the grounds. The Clinton County Fair used the funds to improve the sound system in the



livestock show ring. Urban Farming was the theme of the expanded exhibit at the Erie County Fair showcasing that you can grow yourown food anywhere in a variety of containers. At the Dutchess

County Fair and Lewis County Fair's improved signage in the livestock areas help provide Fairgoers with additional knowledge of the species.

I will be contacting the Fairs that are eligible to participate in the 2019 program in the near future. I look forward to some more great improvement to the Ag areas at the Fair throughout the State.

#### Associate Member Showcase Ryan Gothrup, Mobile Glass Studios Mt. Juliet, Tennessee

Agricultural fairs often feature artists and their work—woodcarving, painting, photography, and more. Ryan Gothrup is a different kind of artist. He is a glass-blower and has been honing his craft for 21 years.

Ryan found his interest in glass-blowing piqued when he was exposed to a class on the subject shortly after finishing high school. He went to college at Kent State and received his masters at Virginia Commonwealth.

Glass-blowing is his passion but attending fairs with his mobile trailer is something new. In 2016, he got a call from King's County Fair, Pennsylvania, in which the Fair management expressed their interest in featuring him as an attraction.

At the time, he had only one mobile trailer. Since then Ryan's business has tripled: he now has three trailers that function as mobile glass-blowing studios each with two employees. On the road he will demonstrate at roughly 10-20 fairs. The hardest part of this expansion explosion? Staffing! Glass-blowing is something of a lost art and staffing is an important aspect of the business. The education and passing-on of the science, art, math, and history involved in the craft are important to Ryan.

It's worth going to a fair just to see Gothrup and his staff perform their demonstrations. Catch them at an event near you or visit them online at www.mobileglassstudios.com.
