2022 Convention Alert!

The 133rd Annual Meeting of the New York State Association of Agricultural Fairs, Inc. will be held January 14 – 17, 2022 at the Joseph A. Floreano Rochester Riverside Convention Center, Rochester, NY.

Hotel Reservations: Make room reservations directly with the Hyatt Downtown Rochester at: 585-546-1234, be sure to advise that you are with "NYSAAF Ag Fairs". The online link is as follows; https://www.hyatt.com/en-US/ group-booking/ROCHE/G-FAIR Register by name and by Fair to eliminate repetition. Cut-off date is December 27 for the hotel. If your Fair is tax exempt, you must present the necessary form at the time of registration. If you choose to make your room reservation outside the Association group block, we need to advise you that the Association can suffer financial penalties. The Association can be held financially responsible for the difference between what was guaranteed in the room block and what was actually utilized.

Registration: The registration desk will be located in the Joseph A. Floreano Riverside Convention Center, Galleria at street level. It will be open 2:00 PM-5:00 PM on Friday; 8:30 AM-4:00 PM on Saturday and 9:00 AM-4:00 PM on Sunday. Enclosed you will find a Registration Form. Please complete and return to: NYSAAF, PO Box G, Elma, NY 14059 by December 15. Registration, banquet and breakfast tickets will increase on December 16. See the enclosed menu options sheet.

Door Prize: Please bring one door prize per Fair for the meetings and leave it at the Registration Desk. Be sure your name is on the item.

Memorial: Enclosed is a memoriam form. Complete and mail to Dr. Marilyn Trainor, 436 Harris Dr., Watertown, NY 13601 by January 1, 2022. We will have a memorial display, so include a picture of the deceased or bring it with you to the convention. All pictures will be returned at the conclusion of the convention.

Past Presidents: The Past Presidents will gather for breakfast, Saturday, January 15th at 7:30am at the Hyatt Hotel, Grand Ballroom. Please purchase your breakfast ticket with your Registration. If you do not plan on eating breakfast, you are still welcome to come and meet with our fellow Past Presidents for a short meeting. Past Presidents should gather for the Opening Ceremony near the Empire Hall, at the Convention Center to enter as a group.

FRIDAY: The NYSAAF Board of Director's Meeting at the Joseph A. Floreano Riverside Convention Center and will be held at 3:00pm, the location to be determined. The President's Reception will be held on Friday, January 14, the exact location to be determined and will begin at 9:00pm.

SATURDAY: A ticketed breakfast will be held at the Hyatt Hotel, Grand Ballroom for \$18.00 per person and will be served from 7:00am to 8:30am. Tickets will be collected at the Buffet line. NO EXCEPTIONS!

Opening Ceremony will be held at 9:00am with Keynote Speakers, Bill Stainton followed by Keynote Speaker, Bill Ogg, CFE sponsored by the Erie County Fair. Also, the Trade Show opens at 11:00am in the Lilac/Highland Ballrooms, with lunch (on your own) available.

Dinner Option: Saturday Evening Buffet dinner is available for \$30.00. This buffet is being offered as an alternative to the hotel restaurant. Buffet tickets must be purchase prior to December 15, 2021. (see the enclosed Menu sheet for the menu choices) Tickets will be collected at the Buffet line.

The Past Presidents' Reception and Scholarship Auction will begin at 7:30pm in the Empire Hall South at the Convention Center.

Auction: The Auction will benefit the Scholarship fund. Each Fair or individual persons are asked to bring an item of minimum value of \$25.00. Crafts and wooden items are popular. They can be left at the Registration Desk. Include the name of your Fair on the item donated.

SUNDAY: A ticketed breakfast will be held at the Hyatt Hotel, Grand Ballroom for \$18.00 per person and will be served from 7:00am to 8:30am. (see the enclosed Menu sheet for more details) Former Fair Manager, Frances Tepper, CFE will introduce her book "Fair Lady". Tickets will be collected the Buffet line. NO EXCEPTIONS!

The General Session Roll Call will begin at 9:00am followed by Keynote Speaker, Alicia Shoults, Ohio State Fair. The Trade Show opens in the Lilac/Highland Ballrooms at 11:00am. A lunch (on your own) will be available in the Trade Show.

Parade: Our Little Red Wagon Parade with a "Highlighting Carnival Fun" theme will begin at 2:45pm. Enclosed is an entry form and instructions. Mail completed form to: Nelson Eddy, 31571 Peck Road, Black Rock, NY 13612, telephone number 315-771-7889.

At 3:30pm Special drawings will take place in the Trade Show area.

At 6:30pm the Annual Banquet will be held followed by the Entertainment Showcase.

Banquet: Ticket Required, \$48.00 Sirloin Steak or Chicken French, before December 15th. \$53.00 on December 16th.

Hall of Fame Award: The Hall of Fame Award will be presented during the Banquet. Enclosed is a Hall of Fame nomination form. Mail completed form to: Hall of Fame Awards Committee, NYSSAF, PO Box G, Elma, NY 14059 by December 1, 2021.

Breakfast: Saturday and Sunday Breakfast tickets will be \$18.00 per person, if purchased by December 15th. The price will increase to \$20.00 on December 16th.



In order for your Fair to be eligible for premium reimbursement for 2021, you must complete the Annual Report sent to you and return to us before December 15, 2021.

The Annual Report, Premium Book and Harness Race Summary (if applicable) are due by December 15, 2021. It is important that you meet this deadline since our calculations cannot be completed until all of the Annual Reports have been received. If your report is received after this deadline, your Fair will be deemed ineligible for reimbursement. Please submit the following:

- 1. Agricultural Society Annual Report (AF-8)
- 2. Harness Race Summary Sheet (AF-1) (if applicable)
- 3. Premium Book
