Ag Awareness helps "Feed New York!"

2016 is the last year of the 5 year rotation for funding County Fair projects. This year 7 fairs will round out the program offering our guests some insight in the importance of agriculture in New York. The participating fairs are; Essex County Fair with a "Glimpse into the Secret Life of the Honeybee" and "Bunny Bonanza". Broome County Fair, where new signs will be directing visitors to the livestock area, the signs will be in the shapes of the animal species. Grahamsville Fair is upgrading animal wash racks and purchasing new rabbit and chicken cages for the comfort of the animals. Hemlock "Little World Fair" will help children learn how to grow vegetables from a seed, as well as an apple exhibit, peek-box to guess the vegetables. Otsego County Fair is building an egg incubator to display eggs hatching and new signs will grace the Dairy Products, Maple Products, and Broom making exhibits. Seneca County Fair's new farrier/blacksmith area should be a big hit. Wyoming County Fair 4-H will host a "Make and Take" agricultural station for the public.

The Board of Directors remains committed to the Ag Awareness program of improving the exhibits and display areas at your Fair's. In 2017, we will begin the next 4 year rotation to provide funds to the fair's for these exhibits. Each fair will have an opportunity to secure these funds in the future.
